

Committee News

The new committee met for the first time last week.

We decided to allocate some special responsibilities. Sid Hayes has agreed to take responsibility for external communications and publicity. Tim McMahon will continue with the newsletter. Martin Connelly is taking responsibility for liaison with judges. Nik Player is going to revamp and maintain the website, and Bruce Levy has agreed to take responsibility for new members.

New member liaison is very important if the club is to grow. Visitors to club meetings should experience the friendliness and helpfulness that our club is supposed to be about. We trust that all the 'old hands' will go out of their way to make new members, and prospective new members, welcome. Don't be surprised if Bruce asks you to buddy up with someone new!

As part of our syllabus for 2013 we propose to hold both member-only and public workshops on aspects of digital photography and camera craft. We are also investigating the possibility of sponsoring/organising a public photographic competition as a way of linking up with more talented photographers in the local community. The main objective for the public workshops and competition is to provide opportunities for more Wairarapa-based photography enthusiasts to know about the club and what we do. Watch this space!

We made some progress on the syllabus for 2013. On the basis of the feedback to Tim's questionnaire about the syllabus, we have decided to reduce the externally judged competitions by one and introduce at least one spot for a guest speaker. Some day trips are back on the agenda, as well as at least one weekend trip. Opinion was divided on inter-club activities, so that will go 'on the back burner' in the meantime. Feedback on meeting frequency was confusing, to say the least. Most people wanted as many competitions as now, and plenty of opportunities for workshops, and external speakers, but wanted no more than one meeting per month. We are working with the relevant authorities to double the number of months in a year! Seriously, details of the syllabus are being finalised and we should be able to announce next year's activities by the end-of-year function.

There was some discussion and agreements about the club's website. It was agreed that the front page needs to be regularly refreshed with news and/or articles, and that the website should be used to maintain a gallery of the best images that come up each month. Currently only those able to attend the monthly meetings see the images. While the Honours and Highly Commended prints are hung for a month in the Masterton Medical Centre, the others, and the projected images, disappear as if into a black hole. As a photography club we should be making our photographs accessible. The idea will be that our website could serve as an archive of the best of club members' work growing month by month. Nik has the work on the website underway.

Competition Judging

The last committee meeting looked briefly at Judging Criteria. Martin and Tim noted that many new members are unaware of the directions that judges have been given on what to look for. Nik noted that judges are often quite inconsistent. Additionally, everyone agreed that the current H,HC,M,C,A grades are confusing, at the least. As Martin noted, every image is accepted in our club, so do we need to say it? Others said they could never remember whether M was better than C or the other way around. And so on!

For these reasons we have begun to think about a new judging rubric to be given to judges. We would also make sure that each member also has it, so that everyone will know what judges are (or should be) looking for and, by implication, what makes a good photograph.

The rubric we are looking at is based on our current judging criteria, the ideas presented to us last year by Bruce Girdwood, and the framework developed by PSNZ (see *A Judging Philosophy* on www.photography.org.nz/resources). Behind the proposed change is the idea that, while judges will



still look primarily for the overall impact of the idea or emotion the image is conveying, they will have a framework that will help photographers see why their images have, or have not, been adjudged as worthy of 'Honours'.

The current proposal looks a bit like this:

If judges are able to use a rubric like this, members will be able to see immediately why judges have reached the decisions they have. Hopefully, more specific feedback such as this will help members further develop the knowledge and skills to make superior photographs.

In a competition, the scores would be totalled and the winning image would be the one that gets the most total points 'out of 12'. We are unsure whether there is any need to turn the aggregated points into an 'Honours', Highly Commended' etc grade system. Our annual champion could still be found on the highest-average-score-per-entry basis as now, but the calculation for the Competition Secretary would be easier: no need to convert grades into numbers!

Notice that, as the proposal stands, the criteria are heavily weighted to the aesthetic, rather than technical, aspects of photography.
